It will benefit the families of CRPF officers and jawans. Dr. Manu Bhatnagar, President-CRPF Welfare Association was the chief guest at the event.

BSES touches all aspects of people's lives, including in their final journey. For the convenience of the grieving families and relatives of the departed soul, BRPL, under its CSR program has donated a set of 15, three seaters (made of steel and with handles) to the Kalkaji crematorium. Apart from this, white-washing and painting work is also being carried-out at the premises.



### Free eye care camps give clear vision to over 1100

Three Eye Care Camps were organised in the Outer West Delhi. Of these 1 was organised in the Jaffarpur Division and 2 in the Najafgarh Division. The success of these camps can be gauged from the stupendous response from around 1140 residents who visited them. Free glasses and medicines were also given to the needy.



### Around 300 people get benefitted in Tobacco De Addiction Programs

Around 300 residents participated in the three, four day, tobacco de addiction programs held in Mahipalpur, Munda and Nangloi. Of these over 200 quit the habit.



### Other activities

- During the month, in association with its NGO partner, BSES renovated 44 toilets in 22 MCD and Government schools in West Delhi. Around 800 students were also sensitised on personal hygiene and sanitation.
- Apart from these initiatives, over 1500 women were sensitised and empowered in and around Joga Bai Nagar, Zakir Nagar and Noor Nagar.
