Discoms donate tablets to govt school students

New Delhi: Deputy chief minister Manish Sisodia distributed tablets among 20 Class XI students from 10 many government schools on Thursday. The tablets have been donated by discoms Tata Power-DCL, BSES Rajdhani (BRPL) and BSES Yamuna (BYPLA).

A total of 1,200 students will receive these tablets. Sisodia described tablet as an important tool of education during Covid-19. BRPL CEO Arsal Sibia, BYPLA CEO PR Kumar and Tata Power-DCL CEO Ganesha Srinivasan were present at the event.

"Soon, the corona vaccine will be released, and this pandemic will be a matter of history. But the loss of education that our students are facing cannot be compensated by any vaccine. To minimise it, Delhi government is working conscientiously," Sisodia said. Efforts are being made to provide online education to government school students but many lack access to the internet or devices, he added.

As the government lockdown has reduced due to the slowdown, "we urged companies to help under CSR initiatives. We are happy that Tata Power-DCL, have given 1,200, BRPL, 500 and BYPLA 300 tablets", he said. Sisodia asked students to return the tablets after the examination time so that others can also benefit.

Sarkam, one of the recipients, said his family shared one phone and he often ended up missing classes if it stopped working. "We had to ask others for help," he said.

New Delhi: Power discom BSES has urged Delhiites to share the love for the environment and switch off their electrical appliances and non-essential lights for one hour starting from 8 pm on Saturday, on the occasion of Earth Hour.

BRPL and BYPLA will also switch off all non-essential lights at their over 400 offices, spread across an area of around 950 sq kms. According to BSES, around 70 MW and 270 MW electricity were saved in 2020 and 2019 respectively during Earth Hour.

- BRPL promoted Women Self Help Groups are stitching and distributing affordable (& reusable) masks & sanitary napkins. During the year, they have stitched and distributed around 67,000 masks and over 27,000 sanitary napkins respectively.

Sanitation - Repair and Maintenance of Crematoriums

BSES touches all aspects of peoples lives, including in their final journey. Doing its bit to give dignity to the departed soul's last journey and to provide comfort to the family and the loved ones during the last rites, BRPL has been sprucing-up the selected crematoriums. It has also provided facilities like Air Coolers, Benches, Chairs, Exhaust Fans , Fans, Water Tanks , Dustbins and proper sanitation



Sanitation - Renovation of school Toilets

Utilising the closure of schools during the Corona pandemic, BRPL renovated 200 toilets in over 100 government schools in West Delhi. It will benefit over 46,000 students once they rejoin the schools after the pandemic.

Health Care - Tobacco De-Addiction Camp

BRPL has been successfully running a tobacco de addiction campaign for the last several years. In FY 2020-21, 10 camps were organised. Of ~ 500 men and women who participated, 375 (or 75%) quit the habit or reduced tobacco consumption substantially



Health Care – Supporting the Differently Abled



Supporting the differently abled with an aim to make them stand on their own feet

Helped children from the National Association for the Blind (NAB) by providing them with the necessary facilities, including Braille and Audio Books. A little help on this front, will aid in their education

Distribution of aids and assistive devices (like artificial limbs etc) to Divyangjans



Under this project, 145 children with Club Foot, including newborns and nursery going children, benefited by getting mobility

Their treatment was started through designated public clinics and healthcare institutions, including Medical colleges, District Hospitals and District Early Intervention Centers.



Yoga Program

For the well-being of our Police personnel and the teaching and the non-teaching staff of schools, 14 Yoga camps were organised at 9 Police stations and 5 Schools. These saw around 800 people, including women, benefitting from them.



Vocational Training Centers

Adapting to the 'new normal', Vocational Training (VT) adopted the hybrid model, wherein the students could either take online classes or attend physical classes (when the classes were allowed to restart). Based on the track record of BRPL's VT Centres, students enrolled over 1100 students for undertaking job oriented courses on Computers, Beauty Culture and Tailoring. The classes are being undertaken by observing full Covid safety protocols. A 'Mega Job Fair' was also organised for the eligible students and saw 140 students, including a large number of women, getting placed with salaries upwards of Rs 10,000



Tree Plantation

BRPL' CSR programs continued to build on the annual tree-plantation drive that started in the July month. During the year, around 30,000 trees were planted the CRPF Camp, Jharonda Kalan in West Delhi, trees were also planted in the Government and MCD Schools, crematoriums etc.



Self Defence Training Program for Girls

Adapting to the 'new normal', BRPL's Self Defence Program for Girls underwent a drastic change and was re-born in its hybrid avatar. During the year, around 1000 girls from 22 schools participated in the training programs that are designed to empower them physically and mentally.
