#### Threads of Empowerment: Dhaga Vishwas Ka

To revive the handloom sector and empower women from economically weaker sections, BSES partnered with SAVE to establish the 'Dhaga Vishwas Ka' Handloom Incubation Centre at Uttam Nagar. Around 82 women received weaving and production training during FY 2025–26. The initiative also promoted market access through exhibitions, stalls and National Handloom Day activities.



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#### Screen to Success: Sashakt Beti

Under the 'Sashakt Beti' initiative, BSES supported economically weaker and visually impaired students of Delhi University through distribution of 524 laptops in partnership with the University of Delhi Foundation. The initiative aims to bridge the digital divide, enhance digital learning access and enable deserving students to pursue higher education with confidence and dignity.



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### Driving Green Care: E-Buses for AIIMS

BSES continued supporting AIIMS Delhi through operation of 27 battery-powered buses facilitating movement of patients, attendants, doctors and staff within the campus. During FY 2025–26, BSES also handed over three additional e-vehicles and initiated procurement of 14 more EVs, further strengthening sustainable and environment-friendly mobility infrastructure at AIIMS. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Hoops of Hope: Nurturing Young Talent

BSES expanded its Basketball Academy initiative through multiple centres across Delhi including IP Extension, Begumpur, West Vinod Nagar and Fatehpur Beri. More than 1,000 schoolchildren are currently undergoing structured training. A state-of-the-art high-performance centre is also being developed at Sarita Vihar to nurture grassroots sporting talent and encourage holistic personality development.



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### Silver Years, Golden Care

BSES Seniors' Abode at Shrinivaspuri continued providing dignified care and holistic support to senior citizens from economically weaker sections. Residents benefited from healthcare services, physiotherapy, counselling, yoga, nutritious meals and recreational activities. The 'BSES Seniors' Shoppe' initiative also enabled residents to showcase and sell handmade products through exhibitions and stalls across Delhi.



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### Nature Nurtured: Greener Community Spaces

BSES continued maintenance and green enhancement activities at DDA Ecological Parks at Kalindi Aviral and Asita East. The initiative included tree plantation, pond cleaning, pruning and environmental awareness activities. On World Environment Day, awareness programs involving schoolchildren were also organised to promote sustainability, biodiversity conservation and environmental responsibility among young citizens.



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### Wings of Change: Skills for Veterans

BSES empowered retiring Army veterans and Veer Naris through skill development programs in solar PV installation and DGCA-certified drone operations. Till February 2026, 148 veterans were trained in solar installation and 193 in drone operations. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Paws for a Cause

Aligned with the Animal Birth Control Rules 2023 and National Rabies Elimination goals, BSES undertook sterilization and vaccination drives for stray dogs and cats in Delhi. Phase I covered 10,000 dogs and 1,000 cats, while Phase II included sterilization and vaccination of 6,086 dogs and 600 cats. Microchipping and digital monitoring systems were also implemented.



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### Healing with Care: Support for VMMC

BSES supported VMMC/Safdarjung Hospital through installation of a multi-sports turf and procurement of advanced medical equipment including portable X-ray machines, ultrasound systems, dental instruments and a silicone prosthetics lab for differently-abled individuals. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Future Ready: Smart Energy Innovation

BSES supported establishment of the Smart Energy Learning Centre at Dhirubhai Ambani University, Ahmedabad. Research projects under the centre focus on recycle and reuse, IoT solutions, intelligent energy systems, data analytics, energy conservation and utility-driven smart energy services. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Skills that Empower

In partnership with NSDC, BSES launched vocational training programs at Palam and Madhu Vihar in Food Product Handling, Digital Marketing and Advanced Tailoring. Around 300 students are currently enrolled with placement support planned after course completion. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Future Minds: Delhi AI Grind

BSES partnered with the Government of Delhi for the 'Delhi AI Grind' initiative encouraging AI-driven innovation among school and college students. District-level events witnessed participation from 585 student teams across 384 schools. Teacher capacity-building masterclasses also benefited around 4,960 teachers. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Championing Inclusive Sports

BSES supported the successful organisation of the World Para Athletics Championships 2025 held in New Delhi with participation from over 2,500 athletes and officials. India secured a record 22 medals during the championship. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Last Rites, Green Way

BSES continued facilitating eco-friendly electric crematorium infrastructure at Nangloi, Lodhi Road and Nigambodh Ghat using advanced electric furnace and chimney technologies aimed at reducing smoke emissions and promoting sustainable last rites infrastructure. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Eyes Wide Open: Vision for All

Around 30 eye screening camps were organised across Delhi benefiting nearly 7,000 people. More than 5,000 spectacles and medicines were distributed after ophthalmic consultations. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Empowering Women, One Pad at a Time

BRPL Self-Help Groups promoted menstrual hygiene awareness and produced over 52,000 sanitary napkins for women from economically weaker sections while simultaneously generating livelihood opportunities. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Breathing New Hope

Supporting the underprivileged sections of the community plagued by tobacco and drug addiction, BRPL has successfully conducted five Tobacco De-Addiction programs with significant success. Around 450 people participated, and over 300 pledged to quit their habit through these programs.



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### Finding Strength Through Yoga

Conducted Yoga programs for the well-being of police personnel, as well as students, teaching and non-teaching staff at government schools. Approximately 2200 people have benefited from 66 yoga camps. Participants were also trained in simple exercises that they can practice in their leisure time to support their well-being.



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### Every Drop Counts

BRPL organised three blood donation camps with over 100 individuals voluntarily donating blood for patients in need of safe blood. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Healthcare at the Doorstep

BSES operated a Mobile Healthcare Unit benefiting around 5,000 individuals through health check-ups and medicine support in underserved areas. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Learning to Livelihood

BRPL vocational training centres offered courses in computers, beauty culture and tailoring benefiting around 2,000 students including visually impaired individuals and persons with disabilities. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Minds in Motion

Mini Science Centres established in government schools promoted practical STEM learning and scientific curiosity among students through interactive exhibits and hands-on learning. The initiative continues to create meaningful community impact while supporting inclusive growth, awareness, empowerment and sustainable development across diverse sections of society.



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### Access to Achieve

BRPL supported the Delhi Police Public Digital Library helping students prepare for SSC, banking and other competitive examinations. 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### Banking on Women

BRPL promoted financial literacy and strengthened Self-Help Groups benefiting around 6,000 women through financial inclusion and banking awareness initiatives. 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### Strength in Action

Self-defence training programs were conducted for over 1,090 girls across schools in association with PCS Foundation to build awareness, confidence and resilience. 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### Water for All

BRPL initiated installation of Water ATMs at multiple locations to provide access to safe drinking water for underserved communities.
