
## Rising to the Rim — Nurturing Young Sporting Talent

BSES scored another winning basket for youth development with the inauguration of a full-size, regulation-standard basketball court at Rajkiya Sarvodaya Kanya/Bal Vidyalaya, West Vinod Nagar, East Delhi—under the BSES Basketball Academy.

Built to give students the right space to play, practise and grow, the new court will benefit nearly 7,000 students from the girls' and boys' schools, helping them build fundamentals, teamwork and confidence through sport.

The inauguration, attended by senior officials and the BSES CSR team, was graced by Dr. Ashok Kumar Gaur, Principal & HOS (Girls School), Dr. Laxmikant Dubey, Principal & HOS (Boys School), and Shri Ravinder Negi, Hon'ble MLA, Patparganj. On court, the energy spoke for itself—from a dribbling showcase by Begumpur School players to competitive 5x5 and 3x3 matches that reflected the spirit of discipline, coordination and team play.

This milestone strengthens BSES' commitment to grassroots basketball across Delhi, with structured coaching and regular training continuing at the BSES Basketball Academy centres—powering young talent, one game at a time.



## Season of Joy — Celebrating Christmas with Seniors

Christmas at the BSES Seniors' Abode Centre, Srinivas Puri was marked by warmth, simplicity and genuine human connection — reflecting the spirit of care that defines the home throughout the year. The Seniors' Abode, a safe and nurturing space for elderly residents, is designed to offer companionship, medical support, nutritious meals and emotional well-being, ensuring that senior citizens live with dignity and comfort.

During the festive celebration, senior residents and BSES staff came together to share conversations, laughter and moments of togetherness. The atmosphere was filled with warmth as residents

participated in the celebrations, exchanged greetings and enjoyed the joy of being remembered and valued. For many seniors, the occasion reinforced a sense of belonging — a reminder that they are part of a caring community that looks after them beyond basic needs.

The celebration reflected the larger philosophy of the BSES Seniors' Abode — that ageing should be accompanied by respect, compassion and companionship. Moments like these go beyond festivities; they reaffirm BRPL's commitment to ensuring that senior citizens feel cared for, heard and supported, not just during festivals, but every single day.



## Vision in Focus — Bringing Clarity, Restoring Confidence

Clear vision is fundamental to education, employment and independent living. During December, BRPL organised seven Eye Care Camps across West Delhi, including Jaffarpur, Chhawla and Palam, in association with I-Care Charitable Hospital and Sagar Trust.

In December alone, 2,625 people attended the camps 1,542 spectacles were distributed and 1,635 medicines were provided. During the current financial year, across 16 camps, 4,958 people attended the camps, with 3,176 spectacles and 2,836 medicines distributed so far. These camps do more than restore eyesight — they help people regain confidence, independence and the ability to go about their daily lives with ease.



## Threads of Trust — Weaving Livelihoods Through Handlooms

BRPL's Handloom Incubation Units — Thread of Trust, located at Sangam Vihar and Uttam Nagar, are empowering women by linking traditional skills to modern income-generation opportunities.

More than 100 women beneficiaries (25 in Sangam Vihar and 82 in Uttam Nagar) are enrolled in handloom machines and allied operations. 43 beneficiaries have been linked with Udyam Aadhaar registrations till December 2025. Products are available on platforms such as Amazon, Flipkart, Meesho, JioMart, India Handmade, MyStore and Artisan Wizard, helping improve visibility and market reach.



## Craft on Display — Celebrating Handloom Heritage

Handloom products were showcased at Surbhi Apartments, SFS Dwarka, Sector-11, offering residents an opportunity to explore authentic handloom creations while supporting traditional artisanship. The products were widely appreciated by visitors.



## Breaking the Habit — Reclaiming Health, Renewing Lives

Tobacco addiction silently undermines health and livelihoods. To counter this, BRPL organised two Tobacco De-addiction Camps at Tigri and Deoli in South Delhi during December. 152 people attended the camps, and 102 individuals successfully quit their tobacco habits.

Across three camps held so far, around 200 people attended OPD, with 143 people quitting their habits. These outcomes show how timely counselling and consistent support can help people take back control of their health and well-being.



## Stitching Dignity — Empowering Women Through Menstrual Hygiene

For many women in slum communities, sanitary napkins remain unaffordable, forcing them to rely on unhygienic alternatives that compromise health and dignity. BRPL is addressing this challenge through the manufacturing and distribution of reusable sanitary napkins, made from tightly woven 100% safe fabric.

In December, 7,045 sanitary napkins were manufactured and 5,578 were distributed. During the current financial year, 36,216 napkins have been stitched and 28,245 distributed. This initiative supports better menstrual hygiene while also creating awareness and livelihood opportunities for women.



## Healing on Wheels — Healthcare That Comes Home

Access to healthcare remains a challenge for many families in rural and underserved urban areas. To bridge this gap, BRPL has launched Mobile Dispensary services providing door-to-door medical check-ups and free medicines, with a special focus on women in South East and South Delhi.

In December, around 1,000 beneficiaries received medical support through this initiative. Around 3,000 people have benefited so far, reinforcing BRPL's effort to make healthcare more accessible, timely and caring.



## Warmth That Cares — Standing with Communities in Winter

To protect vulnerable communities from bone-chilling winter conditions, BRPL distributed blankets and heaters to those in need. Two vans carrying relief materials were flagged off from the LG House in association with the Indian Red Cross Society, ensuring timely winter support for those who need it most.



## Powering Dreams — Where Skills Become Livelihoods

BRPL not only supplies reliable electricity — it powers dreams. Through its Vocational Training Centres, youth from underprivileged backgrounds are acquiring practical skills that open pathways to employment, entrepreneurship and self-reliance.

In December, 79 students enrolled, while 714 students enrolled in the second batch across streams such as

beauty, tailoring and computer courses. Additionally, 960 students successfully completed their respective courses during the first batch (April–September), reflecting steady progress in grassroots skill development.

## Money Matters — Powering Financial Literacy and Inclusion

Financial empowerment begins with awareness and access. Through its CSR initiatives, BRPL is spreading awareness on financial concepts, personal finance and money management, while facilitating bank account opening for individuals willing to join the formal banking system.

In December, around 500 women benefited from this initiative. A total of 4,500 women have benefited during the current financial year, helping build financial confidence, inclusion and long-term security.



## Together We Grow — Self-Help Groups Building Stronger Communities

Self-Help Groups (SHGs) are powerful instruments of social and economic empowerment for women from underprivileged sections of society. Through training in soft toy making, frock stitching, handicrafts, wall hangings, jhumar and bag making, women are being enabled to earn sustainable incomes.



In December, 10 women were enrolled in one SHG. During the current financial year, 230 women have been enrolled across 23 SHGs, helping turn shared effort into confidence and sustainable livelihoods.



## Drops of Care — Quenching Thirst, Nurturing Futures

Water is the foundation of health, learning and well-being. With this belief, BRPL is installing Water ATMs in government schools and community spaces to ensure uninterrupted access to clean and safe drinking water. During December, three Water ATMs were installed at MCD School A-5 Paschim Vihar, MCD Primary School, I-Block Sangam Vihar, and in a community area near Jawalapuri.

These schools and neighbourhoods cater to a large number of children and families from varied socio-economic backgrounds, making the availability of safe drinking water essential for health, concentration and overall well-being — particularly during changing weather conditions.



## Spaces of Dignity — Renewing Cremation Grounds with Respect

Cremation grounds are spaces of solemnity, reflection and dignity. BRPL is actively engaged in the renovation and improvement of cremation grounds at Khair Village, South Moti Bagh and Tilangpur Kotla Vihar.

The work undertaken includes fresh whitewashing, construction of wood sheds, improved seating arrangements and ongoing maintenance activities to enhance cleanliness, safety and organisation. These efforts help ensure that families have access to clean, safe and dignified spaces during life's most difficult moments.
