# Courts of Hope — BSES Basketball Academy Reaches a New Milestone

The inauguration of the BSES–Dribble Academy Foundation High Performance Basketball Centre on 5 May 2026 was a proud moment in BRPL’s journey of community engagement and youth development.

The ceremony was held in the gracious presence of Chief Guest Shri V.S. Verma, Independent Director. The event brought together young players, coaches and the BSES team in a celebration of sport, discipline and opportunity.

The centre has been created to give talented young players access to structured coaching, better facilities and a positive sporting environment. For many children, it is more than a basketball court. It is a space where they can learn teamwork, build confidence and dream bigger.

Through this initiative, BRPL continues to encourage young talent and support children from underserved communities in discovering their potential.



# Global Hoops, Local Dreams — Sacramento Kings Visit BSES Academy

Basketball fever reached a new high at the BSES High Performance Basketball Centre, Sarita Vihar, run by BSES in partnership with the Dribble Academy Foundation.

NBA legend Vlade Divac and the energetic Sacramento Kings dance team visited the centre, bringing global basketball excitement to Delhi. The academy came alive with dribbling showcases, on-court action, performances, dunk contests and unforgettable moments for the young players.

For the children, the visit was much more than meeting an international basketball icon. It was a moment of inspiration. It showed them that dreams

can begin on local courts and travel to the biggest sporting arenas in the world.

The NBA community outreach initiative, organised in collaboration with Visit California and influencer Dhruv Barman, also highlighted how sport can build confidence, discipline, teamwork and healthier lifestyles.

As Vlade Divac interacted with players and coaches, he encouraged them to keep working hard and to believe in the future of basketball in India.

At the BSES High Performance Basketball Centre, the court was not just alive with basketball. It was alive with dreams.



## New Skills, New Beginnings — Drone Pilot Training for Army Veterans and Veer Naris

BRPL is supporting Army veterans and Veer Naris in preparing for new-age livelihood opportunities through drone pilot training.

A certification programme was held at 60 Battalion, Delhi Cantt, on 11 May 2026 under the CSR initiative “Retiring Army Personnel and Veterans in Drone Pilot Training”. Certificates were distributed to 20 personnel who successfully completed the programme.

The training aims to help veterans and Veer Naris build skills in an emerging technology area and explore new career opportunities. It is also a small way of honouring their service by supporting them in the next phase of their lives.



## Healing on Wheels — Healthcare at the Doorstep

For many families in underserved and rural areas, visiting a health facility is not always easy. BRPL's Mobile Dispensary initiative is helping bridge this gap by taking basic healthcare and medicine support directly to communities.

The initiative has a special focus on women in South East and South Delhi. During May, around 1,000 beneficiaries received health check-ups and medicine support. In the current financial year, around 2,000 beneficiaries have benefited from the programme.

By bringing healthcare closer to people, the mobile dispensary is helping families receive timely support and basic medical guidance with greater ease.



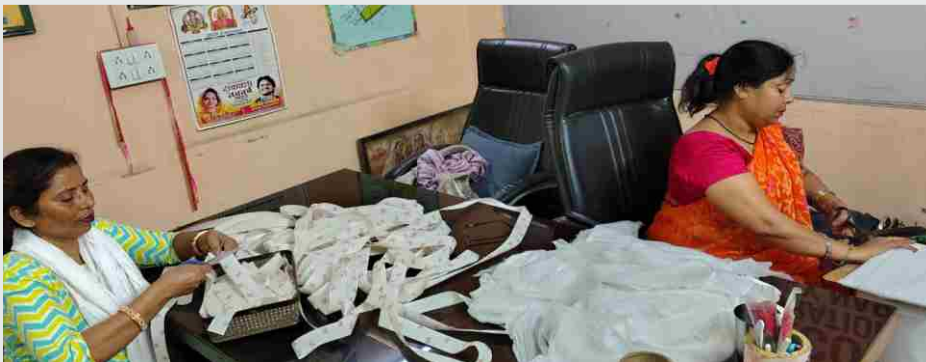
## Stitching Dignity — Supporting Women's Health

BRPL continues to promote menstrual hygiene among women from underserved communities by manufacturing and distributing affordable sanitary napkins.

Many women in these communities are unable to access or afford sanitary napkins and continue to depend on cloth during their menstrual cycle. BRPL's initiative provides them with a safer and more hygienic alternative.

The napkins are made using layers of tightly woven, 100 per cent safe fabric. During May, BRPL manufactured and distributed 2,390 sanitary napkins. In the current financial year, 3,600 napkins have been manufactured and distributed.

The initiative is about more than hygiene. It is about awareness, confidence and dignity.



## Money Matters — Building Financial Confidence

Financial awareness can make a real difference in everyday life. Through its CSR programmes, BRPL is helping women from underserved communities understand savings, budgeting, personal finance and the importance of being part of the formal banking system.

Bank accounts are also being opened for beneficiaries who do not have accounts and wish to join the formal banking system.

During May, around 500 women benefited from the financial literacy drive. In the current financial year, around 1,000 women have been reached through the initiative.

The programme is helping women make more informed financial decisions and build greater confidence in managing money.



# Powering Dreams — Skills for a Better Tomorrow

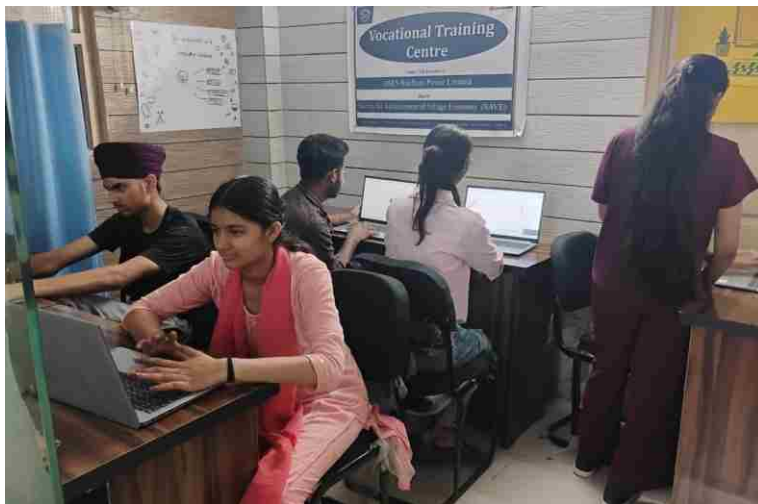
BRPL not only supplies reliable electricity. It also helps power dreams.

Through its Vocational Training Centres, young people from underprivileged backgrounds are learning skills that can help them become more independent and confident. Courses are being offered in areas such as beauty, tailoring and computer education.

During May, around 160 students enrolled in different courses. In the current financial year, 941 students have enrolled in the first batch across various centres.

## Together We Grow — Women Empowering Women

BRPL-supported Self Help Groups are helping women from underprivileged communities learn practical skills and move towards financial independence.

Training has been provided in soft toy making, frock stitching, handicrafts, wall hangings, jhumars and bag making. These skills can help women explore income-generation opportunities from within their own communities.

During May, around 20 women were enrolled in two Self Help Groups. In the current financial year, around 40 women have been enrolled across four Self Help Groups.

These groups are not only about skill-building. They are also spaces where women support one another, build confidence and grow together.



## Threads of Trust — Handloom Livelihoods in Motion

BRPL's Handloom Incubation Units — Thread of Trust — at Sangam Vihar in South Delhi and Uttam Nagar in West Delhi continue to support women through training and livelihood opportunities.

More than 100 women have enrolled in handloom machine operations and allied activities. This includes 25 beneficiaries at Sangam Vihar and 82 beneficiaries at Uttam Nagar.

The initiative aims to help women from weaker sections become self-reliant by linking them with income-generation activities. With every skill learnt and every product created, the women are taking a step towards greater confidence and independence.

Thread by thread, the initiative is weaving dignity, livelihood and hope.
