STAY SAFE: — DON'T FLY KITES NEAR ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS

Kite flying is an integral part of Independence Day celebrations in India. However, this otherwise innocuous activity can sometimes be hazardous—and even fatal. The widespread use of metal-coated manjha, a good conductor of electricity, poses a serious danger not only to the person flying the kite but also to the electricity supply in the area.



Metal-coated manjha can lead to tripping and even electrocution.



Tripping of just one 33/66 kV overhead line can disrupt power supply to over 10,000 residents, while the tripping of a single 11 kV line can affect over 2,500 residents.

MONSOON SAFETY



ESSENTIAL TIPS TO PREVENT ELECTRICAL MISHAPS

Much to everyone's delight, the monsoons are here again! However, with the arrival of the rainy season, comes a unique set of challenges, particularly those related to water-logging and electrical safety. The chances of electricity-related mishaps and incidents increase significantly during this time. Following simple precautions can help you stay safe and ensure an incident-free monsoon.



Stay away from all electrical installations such as electricity poles, substations, transformers, and streetlights.



Caution children not to play near these installations, even if they are barricaded.



Do not touch electrical appliances with wet hands.



Keep a tester at home. If a switch or a wall in your house is wet, do not touch it. First, use the tester to check for any electricity leakage. If needed, call your electrician.



Install Residual Current Circuit Breaker (RCCB) to help avoid shocks and mishaps.



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
