## Self Defence Training



Self Defence trainings were organised in six West Delhi schools in association with Trident Tactical Private Solution, a specialised organisation led by a former SPG commando. Over 700 girls underwent these trainings. Certificates and school bags were also distributed to these students.

## Eye Camps

Nine eye care camps were organised in association with ICare Hospital & Post Graduate Institute. Of these, eight camps were organised in West Delhi areas of Mundka, Jaffarpur, Nangloi and Najafgarh. One camp was organised in Batala House, Jamia Nagar in South Delhi. Over 3608 residents were examined and over 2600 glasses and medicines were distributed.



## Sanitation drive

BRPL undertook an awareness and sanitation drive in 100 MCD schools of South and West Delhi along with 'Sahyog Care for You', a NGO. Besides giving students gyan on issues related to health, sanitation and important of washing hands, toilets were also repaired and spruced-up in 40 schools.
