Happy New Year! On behalf of BRPL, I am delighted to extend my warmest greetings to you and your family members, as we begin yet another journey of challenges, victories, lessons

and changes in 2011 - not just another year, but the beginning of a new decade.

The year 2010 was an eventful one for Delhi in general and BRPL in particular. It saw Delhi successfully hosting the XIX Commonwealth Games. BRPL, along with BYPL, played its part as the host discom with aplomb by living-up to the challenge of powering India's largest ever sporting event without a single power-related incident.

The unprecedented heat wave during the summer of 2010, besides setting new records every other day, saw the electricity demand in Delhi soaring to 4720 MW in June 2010 - its highest ever, an eight percent increase over the maximum demand recorded last year. Despite the rising power procurements costs - going up by 142% since July 2002 - your Discom was fully geared up to meet the demand. We ensured a virtual uninterrupted power supply by maintaining a supply reliability of 99.7%. We are aware that a few pockets still remain where the supply situation and the network needs improvement. We are sure that we shall improve the same very speedily to provide quality uninterrupted service.

During the year 2011, our focus will be on supply side management and improving the Outage Management System (OMS) and SCADA interface. In our quest to improve the last mile customer interface, we are also working to enhance employee morale, motivation and training to provide improved services. Our focus would be to strengthen consumer/ stakeholder satisfaction levels and taking them to a new high by further strengthening and simplifying systems and procedures, adopting new technologies and incorporating latest advances in IT and Customer Care.

We re-dedicate our resolve to strive to serve you better, provide quality 24 x 7 power supply and consolidate our relationship with you. In the end, I would like to appeal to all consumers to conserve electricity to lessen the impact of global warming.
