January was a month dedicated to strengthening community bonds and advancing meaningful initiatives. Under the Sashakt Beti Initiative, 524 laptops were distributed to underprivileged girl students of Delhi University, enabling greater access to digital learning and fostering inclusion. As part of the Energy Conservation Awareness Project for

schoolchildren, 124 teachers from 81 schools were trained. These educators will further guide over 17,500 students on sustainable energy practices. The month also witnessed celebrations filled with warmth, as Lohri was observed at the BSES Seniors' Abode and the Handloom Centre. On Republic Day, the BSES Basketball Academy organised basketball matches for boys and girls at the BYPL Sports Centre, IP Extension.

BSES Empowers Futures with Laptop Distribution

As part of the Sashakt Beti Initiative, the BSES team, led by Shri Amal Sinha, Director and Group CEO, BSES, along with the Vice Chancellor of University of Delhi, Shri Yogesh Singh, distributed 524 laptops to orphaned, single-parent (with limited income), and visually impaired girl students.



Energy Conservation Awareness Training for Teachers

BSES Yamuna Power Limited in collaboration with The Energy and Resources Institute (TERI) conducted a two-day Teachers' Training Programme on Energy Conservation and Efficiency for Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) schools. A total of 124 teachers from 81 MCD schools participated in the training from East and Central Delhi Zones of Shahdara South, Shahdara North, and Karol Bagh. The programme aimed to strengthen their understanding of energy-related concepts and ways of incorporating such learnings into pedagogy for schoolchildren.



Festive Lohri and Medical Check-Ups for Seniors

BSES Director Shri Virendra Singh Verma, along with the CSR team, celebrated Lohri with the residents of BSES Seniors' Abode. The festivities, marked by music, dance, and sweets, fostered a cheerful atmosphere for the seniors.

This month, the residents also underwent comprehensive free medical check-ups to support their health and well-being. The initiative included 20 eye consultations at Synergy Eye Care, three cataract surgeries, and the distribution of hearing aids to eight residents. In addition, the seniors underwent essential diagnostic tests, including Liver Function Tests (LFT), Kidney Function Tests (KFT), and Complete Blood Count (CBC).



Handloom Promotion through Cultural Celebrations

On the occasion of Lohri, handloom exhibition-cum-sale stalls were organised in Paschim Vihar and Moti Nagar to promote handloom products and support women entrepreneurs. The stalls showcased creations by community artisans and recorded sales exceeding ₹9,500, reflecting demand for handloom products.

Makar Sankranti was also celebrated at the BSES Handloom Incubation Centre with women trainees, where the BSES team joined festivities marked by cultural activities and creative showcases.



BSES Basketball Academy Celebrates Republic Day

The BSES Basketball Academy celebrated Republic Day at the BYPL Sports Centre, IP Extension. Players from IP Extension and Begumpur came together for friendly 3x3 basketball matches for girls and boys, fostering their skills and the spirit of unity. Winners were awarded basketballs, capping off the celebration on a high note.



BYPL Wraps Up Eye Care Initiative with 15 Community Camps

BYPL organised four free eye care camps at BYPL Old Kondli Grid, G.B. Pant Grid, Pandav Nagar, and Dharamshala Shiv Mandir, Karkardooma Gaon, benefiting 1,329 people. The camps provided comprehensive eye examinations and reading glasses, benefiting the weaker sections of society.

In this month, we concluded the eye care initiative, taking the total to 15 camps and over 5,300 individuals served across communities.



Clear Vision, Bright Future: BYPL Empowers Students

BYPL's eye screening programme for school children supported 302 students this month by providing eye care guidance and distribution of spectacles.

Overall, the initiative has positively impacted 3,831 students across 11 MCD schools ensuring access to quality eye care they need to thrive both inside and outside the classroom.



Training Initiative Enables Army Veterans Careers

The 9th batch of the Drone Pilot Training Programme trained 20 Indian army veterans, providing certification in relevant operational skills for the growing drone sector. Till date the project has benefitted 193 veterans, with training focused on flight safety, simulator operations, and drone maintenance.

BSES, in collaboration with the Indian Army and the Army Welfare Placement Organisation (AWPO), also facilitated placements for veterans who have completed Solar PV Installation training in roles such as Technical Support Manager and Relationship Manager, creating career opportunities after retirement.
