March was a month of impactful initiatives for BYPL, reflecting its focus on community development, innovation, and sustainability. One of the key highlights was the Science Innovation Competition under the Atal Tinkering Lab initiative, where 540 students from six government schools presented their creativity and problem-solving skills through innovative projects. The event demonstrated how STEM education can be effectively leveraged for social good.

Another significant achievement was BYPL's contribution to strengthening the public healthcare delivery system. By upgrading the operation theatre at Jag Pravesh Chandra Government Hospital and installing advanced diagnostic equipment at Rajiv Gandhi Super Specialty Hospital, BYPL enhanced treatment capabilities and improved patient care.

In addition, BYPL focused on community safety by organizing a Fire Safety Awareness Programme in West Patel Nagar. Through live demonstrations and expert guidance, the initiative equipped residents with essential life-saving skills and enhanced their preparedness for emergencies.

BYPL's Initiative Sparks Student Innovation

As part of BYPL's Atal Tinkering Lab initiative, 540 students from six government and government-aided schools participated in a Science Innovation Competition to promote scientific temper and experiential learning.

The first prize was won by three students from Government Boys Senior Secondary School at New Ashok Nagar for their project "AI Smart TV Control." The second prize went to Mukherjee Memorial Senior Secondary School for "Transmission and Fault Detection System in Power Transmission," while the third prize was secured by a group of girls from CM Shri Nand Nagri School for their "Home Care Automation" project.

The event showcased how STEM education can drive social good while providing students a platform to demonstrate innovation, creativity, and problem-solving skills.



Empowering Communities with Fire Safety

BYPL conducted a Fire Safety Community Awareness Programme at Sada Shiv Panchayati Mandir, West Patel Nagar. The programme saw participation from Patel Nagar Division and Head Office officials. It enhanced community preparedness and safety awareness.

The programme included live demonstrations and expert guidance. It equipped community members with essential life-saving skills and practical knowledge to enhance safety and preparedness in their daily lives.



BYPL Enhances Public Health Care Delivery System

BYPL enhanced and modernised healthcare facilities within the public healthcare delivery system. It upgraded the operation theatre at Jag Pravesh Chandra Government Hospital with advanced OT equipment. These included an OT table, cautery machine, double dome OT lights, and a video laryngoscope to improve treatment services.

Additionally, at Rajiv Gandhi Super Specialty Hospital, a blood bank refrigerator, immunoassay analyzer, and vertical autoclave were installed. These additions strengthen diagnostic capabilities and patient care, further reinforcing the public healthcare delivery system.



BSES Supports Local Artisans with Handloom Showcase

BSES organised an exhibition-cum-sale of handloom products under its CSR initiative “Dhaga Vishwas Ka” at the courtyard of the State Emporium Shops on Baba Kharag Singh Marg.

The HPC is a state-of-the-art basketball training facility at Sarita Vihar, with world-class infrastructure, including accommodation for 20 trainees.

The U-16 Boys, U-16 Girls, and U-12 Boys teams participated in a 5x5 tournament, where the U-16 Boys team won the trophy.

Additionally, a BSES Basketball Academy student was selected to represent East Delhi in the Under-19 Delhi State Championship, where the team secured a bronze medal.
