## BYPL Strengthens Learning Support with Sashakt Gyan Kendra

On 21 November, BYPL inaugurated the Sashakt Gyan Kendra at Ganga Vihar in the presence of Shri Umesh Kumar, SHO, Gokulpuri Police Station and the senior BYPL officials led by Shri Suresh Agarwal. The centre will support over 500 students by providing digital learning, academic assistance, career guidance, and preparation for government examinations.



## BSES U-18 Team Shines at Sansad Khel Mahotsav

The U-18 Girls team of the BSES Dribble Academy won a Bronze Medal at the Sansad Khel Mahotsav and was felicitated by Shri Harsh Malhotra, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Corporate Affairs, Road Transport and Highways, and Shri Arvinder Singh Lovely, Hon'ble Chairperson of the Trans Yamuna Area Development Board.

The BSES Begumpur U-19 team also delivered an impressive performance at the 39th Daulatram Memorial Tournament, reaching the quarter-finals and semi-finals, with five players selected for the Delhi State School Games. Friendly matches were organised on Children's Day in the presence of BYPL officials to encourage young talent.



## BYPL Empowers Students with Hands-on STEM Learning

On 19 November 2025, BYPL inaugurated 10 new Mini Science Centres, including one at Govt. Girls Sr. Sec. School, West Patel Nagar, in the presence of school authorities and BYPL officials. These centres are part of BYPL's STEM initiative to establish science laboratories in 65 Delhi government schools and feature 80 hands-on science models, benefiting nearly 85,000 students by strengthening concepts in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Biology through experiential learning.



## BYPL Promotes Healthy Living Through Tobacco De-Addiction Camps

BYPL organised three tobacco de-addiction camps, each spanning four days, led by Dr. Sajeela Maini of Sir Ganga Ram Hospital. The camps were held at Azad Market, Peerji Chowk and Janta Colony. It benefited 227 community members through structured counselling, medical support, and steam inhalation therapy, enabling many participants to overcome tobacco addiction.



## BYPL Supports Vision Health

In November, BYPL organised three free eye screening camps at Seelampur Grid, Janta Colony, and Ganga Vihar. The camps offered comprehensive eye examinations, reading glasses, and essential medicines to over 1,143 participants, promoting better vision and overall well-being.



## BYPL Reduces Urban Heat with Cool Roofs

This month, BYPL completed Cool Roof projects at Shyam Lal College and Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College. The initiative promotes energy efficiency and sustainable urban development by reducing heat absorption in buildings. As part of this effort, BYPL has painted the rooftops of public buildings, colleges, and schools with certified white reflective paint approved by GRIHA (Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment) and IGBC (Indian Green Building Council).



## BYPL Promotes Eye Health Across MCD Schools

This month, BYPL conducted eye screenings for 2,349 students across six MCD Primary Schools in Mayur Vihar, East Vinod Nagar, Seelampur (morning and evening shifts), Chand Mohalla, and Rajgarh Colony. The initiative focused on early detection of refractive errors, eye health awareness, and personalized guidance, with 263 children provided spectacles to support their learning and development.
