In the last few years, large scale construction activity is taking place in Delhi. Some of it is unauthorized and being done in a haphazard manner. Many of these dwellings and unauthorized constructions / extensions - built in various colonies have come underneath and dangerously close to BSES' existing overhead Low Voltage (LV), High Voltage (HV) and Extra High Voltage (EHV) lines and electricity installations.

Such constructions and 'extensions' are in complete violation of Rule 58, 60 and 61 of the Central Electricity Authority (Measures relating to safety and Electric Supply) Regulations 2010 and related provisions of the Indian Electricity Act 2003 (Section 53 and 68 (5) read with Section 161). These rules have been framed for your safety, to avoid any mishap, fatal accidents and power disruptions.

BSES once again appeals to the owners of such unauthorized constructions to remove their illegal and unauthorised constructions from near the electricity mains and installations.

POWER TARIFF: DELHI VS NCR

- Despite a hike in the power tariff, Delhiites would still be paying less per unit consumed as compared to their neighbours in Gurgaon and Noida.
- An average Delhi household, which uses up 2KW load and consumes 300 units per month, would have to now pay ₹3.70 per unit. Residents of Gurgaon,
- consuming the same amount of power are paying ₹3.87 per unit and those in Noida pay ₹4.65, according to the Delhi Electricity Regulatory Commission.
- Delhiites would also be paying less than the residents of Kolkata and Mumbai, who pay ₹4.83 and ₹4.86 for the same amount of power.
